WHEREAS, California grows more than 473,000 acres of winegrapes producing more than 3.98 million tons of grapes per year valued at almost \$2.3 billion, with a direct and indirect impact on California's economy of more than \$15.2 billion, to which Napa County contributes more than \$10.9 billion; and

WHEREAS, the destructive and incurable Pierce's disease poses a significant and imminent threat to Napa's important grape and wine industry; costing growers annual losses of more than \$15 million, and

WHEREAS, a non-native vector for Pierce's disease, the *Glassy-Winged Sharpshooter*, has been determined to carry and spread this disease to many forms of California agriculture, usually with complete destruction to the infected crop; and

WHEREAS, to avoid a potentially catastrophic loss to Napa County's winegrape and wine industry, it is important that County residents know more about the *Glassy-Winged Sharpshooter* and how to help prevent its introduction and establishment.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Dodd, Chair of the Napa County Board of Supervisors, hereby proclaim the month of May 2011 to be *Glassy-Winged Sharpshooter Month* in Napa County and encourage local media, business organizations, wineries and fellow residents to increase their knowledge and awareness of Pierce's Disease and the *Glassy-Winged Sharpshooter* to enable the entire community to prevent the pest from being introduced into Napa County and destroying our crops.
