## City of Napa and County of Napa Service Sharing Study Outline of PowerPoint for Joint Meeting April 17, 2012

### **Meeting Purpose**

Create a consensus on implementing service sharing recommendations from the Advisory Committee and agree on next steps.

### 1. Review service sharing project

- Phase 1 analysis: Threshold level analysis to identify consolidation efforts that might be productive for further follow up
  - Question to be answered: Is it feasible for a specific service to be shared?
  - Threshold analysis does not answer all detailed questions.
- Phase 2 analysis: Detailed analysis for those service areas showing promise for service sharing between the City and County

### 2. Review methodology

- Interviewed elected officials and staff to identify potential service sharing and colocation possibilities
- Assessed ideas, applied criteria related to cost savings, difficulty of implementation and models that exist elsewhere
- Met with staff committee 2 times on site to review information and obtain feedback
- Met with Advisory Committee 3 times (once to discuss initial ideas, once to present preliminary data and receive direction on which services to analyze, once to present threshold analysis)
- Conducted threshold analysis for six areas; met on site with staff to gather information about each of these areas:
  - Engineering/Construction Management
  - Streets and Roads Management (including signing and striping)
  - Fleet Management/Maintenance
  - Law Enforcement Investigations
  - Law Enforcement Records
  - Permit Services and Plan Review

### 3. Review Advisory Committee's comments on opportunities for service sharing

- Service sharing is a valid goal for the City and County
- Greatest opportunities are in the general government arena, not in law enforcement, health, welfare or areas that are unique to either the City or County government
- Service sharing should be focused on some short-term opportunities and longerterm opportunities
- To be successful, focus needs to be on long-term effort to integrate service delivery where it makes sense. Focus cannot be solely on short-term cost savings, because it takes time to build a foundation for successful integration efforts, particularly when facility sharing is a cornerstone.

# 4. Review Advisory Committee's recommendations for service sharing ideas to pursue during a next phase

- Proceed with these in the short term
  - 1. Prepare joint policy statement to pursue more unified service delivery in the future
  - 2. Pursue development of business plans for service sharing and consolidations in the following areas:
    - Engineering design and CIP administration
    - Streets and roads maintenance activities
    - Fleet management and maintenance
    - Fire prevention
  - Collaborate on shared data collection and performance measure initiatives in permit processing and other areas, where long term service sharing and joint facility utilization is a goal
    - Example of the type of data necessary to make good decisions

### Pursue in the long term

- 1. Plan for and construct a joint corporation yard in an industrial area (which would include a joint facility for fleet maintenance)
- 2. Plan for and construct a joint CNG fuel facility, perhaps as a first phase to a shared corporation yard
- 3. Plan for and develop a co-location site for permit processing and a shared IT system to support this service
- 4. Other areas to be identified based on the joint policy statement

#### 5. Review areas studied but not being recommended for service sharing

- 1. Law enforcement investigations and law enforcement records
- 2. Policy planning and entitlement functions

### 6. Recommended Phase 2 assistance

- Fleet management (identify options for co-locating staff in one facility; develop a business plan for consolidating fleet staffs, evaluate potential for outsourcing some current work to make joint facility utilization feasible
- Finalize fire prevention consolidation business plan

- Develop a business plan for service sharing in the area of engineering design and CIP administration
- Develop a business plan for service sharing in the area of streets and road maintenance
- Assist the County and City in preparing a joint policy statement to pursue more unified service delivery opportunities in the future

### 7. Reach consensus on next steps
