Prevention Project	Marin Napa Solano Sonoma	The North Bay Suicide Prevention (NBSP) project is a regional initiative aimed at expanding accredited, locally responsive Suicide Prevention and Crisis Hotline services to six North Bay communities. NPSP will reduce suicide in the six North Bay counties of Marin, Sonoma, Napa, Lake, Solano, and Mendocino. By 2015, all people living in North Bay counties will have access to immediate, confidential, high quality and effective 24/7 Suicide Prevention Hotline services. The hub of services will be located at Family Service Agency of Marin (FSA), which will serve as the NBSP lead agency. The project is a collaboration between FSA and the six North Bay county governments.
Partnership HealthPlan of California Commission	Marin Napa Solano Sonoma	The commission negotiates the exclusive contract with the California Department of Health Care Services as specified in Section 14087.5 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, and arranges for the provision of health care services for the county's Medi-Cal recipients (Participants: Napa, Solano, Sonoma, Marin, Yolo Counties)
San Francisco Bay Conservation Development Commission (BCDC)	Marin Napa Solano Sonoma	Dedicated to the protection and enhancement of San Francisco Bay and its responsible use. Primary activities are planning the protection, enhancement, and restoration of wetlands; protecting wetlands, and balancing the protection of wetlands against other often high priority objectives.

Developmental Disabilities Board (Area IV)	Napa Solano Sonoma	<p>"Developmental Disability" means a disability which originates before an individual attains the age 18, continues, or can be expected to continue, indefinitely, and constitutes a substantial handicap for such individual...shall include mental retardation, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism and handicapping conditions found to be closely related to mentally retarded individuals but shall not include other handicapping conditions that are solely physical in nature.</p> <p>Four members appointed by each Board of Supervisors of Napa, Solano and Sonoma counties, five members appointed by the Governor.: Section 4570 et seq Welfare and Institutions Code of the State of California (Requires special application)</p>
Golden Gate Bridge District	Marin Napa Sonoma	<p>Operates the Golden Gate Bridge and two public transit systems with a mission to provide safe and reliable operation, maintenance and enhancement of the Golden Gate Bridge and to provide transportation services, as resources allow, for customers within the U.S. Highway 101 Golden Gate Corridor.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>City and County of San Francisco (9 Directors)</li> </ul>
