

Napa County's MSA Grant

Process Recommendations to the Board of Supervisors

Greetings,

Every year after MSA awards have been made, HHSA surveys everyone who applied for funds to ask their opinion on the process and to propose changes for the next cycle. The responses to those questions have been used to finalize the proposal presented to the Board of Supervisors for managing the **next grant application** cycle.

We are asking **your opinion** on our responses to the recommendations (see email attachment) by filling out a **short survey** no later than Monday, January 11, 2016. We will collate the responses and present them to the Board of Supervisors on the February 2, 2016 Board meeting. We anticipate opening the application period on February 3, 2016 and having a pre-application meeting on that date. Applications will be due on March 23, 2016.

The attached report concludes that our process is transparent, competitive and has encouraged the use of evidence-based practices and further that it has helped a number of health and human services organizations serve a wide-range of community needs. The County's consultant thinks the process can benefit from streamlining the application processs, expanding its definition of evidence-based practices, and revising its scoring criteria. Longer-term, she thinks that Napa County has an opportunity to significantly increase its funding impact through the setting of clear goals, priorities, evaluation processes, and alignment with other initiatives and resources.
