- CARCD is still having budget woes. They are thankful for our on-going full membership and donation to CSG. They may be adjusting their membership dues in the next year.
- DOC and CSG helped to obtain \$2.5M for RCD capacity building from the State general fund.
- CARCD will be developing two new committees to help them represent RCDs in the area of soil and water.
- Conference 2017 will be in Sacramento.

 CARCD has applied for private foundation funds to continue and expand RCD capacity building programs.

## 8. REPORT FROM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, DISTRICT CONSERVATIONIST AND DIRECTORS' COMMENTS

Emma reported on the following:

- Emma participated in the February LandSmart workshop.
- Emma and Leigh submitted a contribution agreement request to NRCS which would provide funds to RCD to assist NRCS capacity building, conservation planning, demonstration projects, and outreach.
- Emma and Frances participated in a conversation about "Carbon Farm Planning" with regional RCDs and NRCS Offices, the State NRCS Office, Carbon Cycle Institute, Marin Carbon Project and Marin Ag Land Trust. The intent of the meeting was to build partnerships and understanding about working together for a common goal around soil health.
- Emma attended MobilizeGreen Diversity Career Fair in Oakland.
- Kelly assisted at a LandSmart for Kids field day at Sheehy Creek.
- A Quality Assurance Review (QAR) is scheduled for the Napa Office on March 21 23
- NRCS continues to be very busy with Emergency Watershed Program requests in partnership with local sponsors to address streambank failures and threat to structures from recent storms.
- Corporations may participate in RCPP by requesting an AGI waiver if they exceed the \$900K cap.
- Agriculture Conservation Easement Program (ACEP) is available for wetland and agricultural land easements through NRCS. Easement terms can be 30 years or permanent.

### Leigh reported on the following:

- RCD received three responses to a RFP for geomorphic and design work for the Bale Slough / Bear Creek project. A contractor will be selected and a contract brought to the Board in April.
- Bark in the Park community dog walk was held in American Canyon to promote responsible dog walking. RCD spoke on KVYN to raise awareness about pet waste pathogens, proper waste disposal, and Bark in the Park.
- LandSmart Vineyard Planning Workshop was conducted with 25 participants.

- Oak Maintenance has started with 40 volunteers from Freemark Abbey helping us at Alston Park.
- Youth Council students attended a day-long Youth for the Environment & Sustainability conference in San Francisco with Guadalupe. One member of the Council was a special presenter and spoke at the conference.
- RCD staff has been working with City of American Canyon, City of Napa, and Skyline Park staff related to evaluating unpaved roads/trails at Newell, Alston, Westwood Hills, and Skyline Parks.
- The rotary screw trap was installed and will begin to operate in early March.
- The WILD speaker series is expanding. We'll be in American Canyon and St. Helena in March.
- Our concept proposal to CDFA to assist us in implementing the carbon farm plan at HCV and utilizing HCV as a regional and state-wide demonstration was approved and we submitted the final proposal for consideration this week.
- Vehicle use is getting complicated and Leigh will begin researching options to obtain a new vehicle through purchase or lease. She will get input from the financial advisory committee and ultimately the Board before action is taken.
