






Accomplishments for 2016





Trauma System

- Queen of the Valley Medical Center
 Trauma Center Designation/Verification
 - QVMC received Level III Trauma Center Verification from the American College of Surgeons.
 - Current Level III Trauma Center Agreement was extended to June 30, 2019.



Current Projects - ePCR

- Universal Electronic Patient Care Reporting (ePCR) System
 - All 9-1-1 ambulance and advanced life support first responder agencies will be using a single system effective August 1, 2017.
 - New system will allow for better coordination of patient care, sharing of information and improve operational efficiencies for providers.

Current Projects - Stroke

- Currently working with hospitals to establish a new Stroke System of Care
 - Implementation scheduled for October 2017.
 - New system will enhance the coordinated care provided to patients suffering from stroke systems from before they call 9-1-1 until they are discharged from the hospital.

American Medical Response (AMR) Contract Performance

- American Medical Response contract was extended by the Napa County Board of Supervisors in 2016.
- Contract extension started January 2017 and will provide emergency ambulance services through 2021




AMR Contractual Performance

- AMR met all contractual response time requirements for calendar year 2016.
- Contract calls for 90% response time compliance.
 - AMR responded on time to 96.63% of all requests for service in 2016.

2017 and Beyond

- Overhaul of EMS Agency Administrative Policy and Patient Treatment Protocols
 - New treatment protocols are designed to provide additional resources for responders and implement EMS best practices.
- Mealth Information Exchange
 - Currently working with new ePCR system to establish a Health Information Exchange network between hospitals and responders.
