## PROCLAMATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Government Code section 8630 and Napa County Code section 2.80.060(A)(2) authorize and empower the Napa County Executive Officer/Director of Emergency Services or Assistant Director of Emergency Services, to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when the County is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity and the Board of Supervisors is not then in session, subject to confirmation by the Board of Supervisors within seven days thereafter; and

**WHEREAS**, the Assistant County Executive Officer has been designated as the Assistant Director of Emergency Services; and

**WHEREAS**, the Assistant County Executive Officer has found that due to the Steele Fire that began burning in Napa County on July 28, 2018, a condition of extreme peril to life and property now exists in the area including and around the Steele Fire in the Berryessa Highlands in Napa County; and

WHEREAS, the Napa County Board of Supervisors is not presently in session.

## NOW, THEREFORE, THE NAPA COUNTY ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE OFFICER/ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES DECLARES AND PROCLAIMS, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Conditions of extreme peril to the safety or persons and property have arisen within Napa County starting on July 28, 2018 due to the Steele Fire.
- 2. On July 28, 2018, Edmund G. Brown Jr., Governor of the State of California, proclaimed a State of Emergency in several counties, including in Napa County due to the Steele Fire.
- 3. As a result of said conditions and pursuant to Government Code section 8630 and Napa County Code section 2.80.060(A)(2), a local emergency now exists in the area including and around the Steele Fire in the Berryessa Highlands in Napa County.
- 4. During this local emergency, the powers, functions, and duties of the Napa County Executive Officer and Assistant County Executive Officer shall be those prescribed by State law, and the ordinances, resolutions, and approved emergency services plans of Napa County.
- 5. This Board of Supervisors shall review this proclamation of local emergency within seven days and if not ratified and continued by the Board of Supervisors, shall expire on the seventh day or such earlier date as specified by said Board.

6. This proclamation shall be promulgated in as widespread a manner as reasonably feasible in light of the conditions prevailing during the local emergency.
