In my 46 year career as a registered nurse/nurse practitioner, I worked 2 years in hospital nursing, 2 years in public health and 42 years as a Family Nurse Practitioner. After completing a 6 months internship in Warm Springs Confederated Tribe medical clinic and graduating from UC Davis I worked as a nurse practitioner in a variety of settings. My responsibilities were to provide primary care to all ages including older adults. I worked for the Department of State Foreign service for twenty years living and working overseas and providing medical care for American Embassy employees and their families. I provided occupational health as well as primary care to National employees. I retired from the US Department of State in late 1999 and relocated to Napa County. My local medical experience included one year at COPE as a public health nurse and then for 13 years for Community Health Clinic Ole (Ole Health). I retired December 2014. After retirement I went on a medical mission to the Dominican Republic with Somos Amigos and volunteered for one shift thru Ole Health at the Calistoga Fairgrounds shelter after the Valley Fire.

University of California Master gardeners of Napa County since 2000. I have volunteered over 1000 hours and currently am co-chair of the compost committee and member of the Latino Outreach Committee.

Current participation in CanDo CanGrow a program dedicated to provide vegetables for the Food Bank, CanDo Waterway Keepers which picks up trash along the Napa River and collaborates with other organizations to educate and keep the waterways clean. Served as site captain at the Earth day and Coastal Clean cleanups. Neighborhood Coordinator for the Green Bag food project which collects nonperishable food for the Food Bank.

Explain reasons for wishing to serve and in your opinion, how you would contribute:

The past two years on the Commission on Aging I have been on a steep learning curve learning about the different programs and resources for older adults. I have served on a committee focusing on food insecurity and was an active participant with LHNC's The Napa County Emergency Food System Study . An opportunity to provide a health promotion talk to Latino Elder Coalition attendees arose and I copresented with Jesus Prado, RN. I have recently joined the Napa Continuum of Care program thru NCCOA. I have become increasingly aware of the issues related to older adults. It is my sincere desire to continue to serve and improve awareness of issues of the older adult.

I am honored to be nominated by Supervisor Alfredo Pedroza to represent District 4 on the Commission on Aging. I know my predecessor Betty Rhodes and well aware of her amazing contributions to the Community and the Commission.
