## NAPA COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 2019-42

## RESOLUTION OF THE NAPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO PROVIDE STATE AID UNDER THE CALIFORNIA DISASTER ASSISTANCE ACT

**WHEREAS**, the Napa County Executive Officer / Director of Emergency Services found there exists throughout the County a condition of extreme peril to life and property due to the impacts of the storm events as of February 26, 2019; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors ratified and continued the Proclamation of Local Emergency of its Director of Emergency Services, proclaiming the existence of a local emergency based on the impacts to public infrastructure from the storms, and the resulting condition of extreme peril to life and property throughout the County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors has found the condition of extreme peril to life, safety, and property is continuing; and

**WHEREAS**, the impacts of the storm present a threat to public safety and constitute a disaster under the California Disaster Assistance Act; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors now finds that local resources are unable to cope with the effects of this emergency;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. The Board of Supervisors requests that the Governor Proclaim a State of Emergency relating to the recent storms that have caused significant damage to public and private infrastructure in Napa County and many of the surrounding counties and jurisdictions. The Board of Supervisors further requests that the Governor grant assistance under the California Disaster Assistance Act, and the State Nonprofit Organizations Assistance Program if applicable, to Napa County and eligible community members and businesses to the fullest extent possible. The County Executive Officer is directed to forward a copy of this resolution through the State Director of the Office of Emergency Services to the Governor of California.
- 2. The Board of Supervisors further designates its County Risk Manager and/or County Emergency Officer as the local Hazard Mitigation Coordinator(s) of Napa County for the purpose of assessing damage within this County and consulting with State and any Federal survey teams about hazard mitigation actions.
- 3. The Board of Supervisors further designates the County Executive Officer, County Auditor-Controller, and/or County Treasurer-Tax Collector as the authorized representative(s) of Napa County for the purposes of receipt, processing and coordination of all inquiries and requirements necessary to obtain available state and federal assistance

and to accept such assistance and emergency funding as may be available on behalf of the County.

4. The Board of Supervisors further requests that the Governor, to the extent possible, waive any monetary matching requirements that Napa and surrounding counties, and local agencies within those jurisdictions, might otherwise be responsible for under federal or State emergency aid programs. In the event such waiver is not possible, the Board requests the Governor indicate support for the introduction and passage of state legislation that would make such local monetary matching waivers possible.
