Amendment No 3 to Agreement with Boston Reed Company, Inc. SUBJECT:

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Health and Human Services requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign Amendment No. 3 to an agreement (formerly AUD 5690) with Boston Reed Company, Inc., increasing the annual maximum by \$8,790 for a new maximum of \$18,715 and amending the scope of work to include additional courses to provide training services to clients participating in Workforce Napa programs.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Boston Reed Company provides educational opportunities to adults seeking careers in the healthcare industry by offering a variety of health career certificate programs. Approval of the recommended action will increase the maximum amount of the compensation to enable nine additional clients to attend training. Since the aggregate amount paid to this contractor will exceed the Purchasing Agent's authority to sign the amendment, it is being presented to the Board for its approval.

Discretionary Justification: This contract is discretionary in that the service provided by this contractor is not mandated. As the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) provider for the County, Napa County Workforce Napa programs must spend a portion of WIA grant money on direct client services. Approval of this amendment will allow Boston

Reed to continue providing direct client services.

Is the general fund affected? No

Future fiscal impact: The agreement contains an automatic renewal provision, which allows the

County the option to continue these services in the following fiscal

year. Funding for Fiscal Year 2010-2011 has been included in HHSA's Fiscal

Year 2010-2011 budget request.

Consequences if not approved: If this amendment is not approved, the contractor will be unable to provide

additional training to Workforce Napa programs.

Additional Information: This agreement may be funded by Workforce Investment Act (the annual

"formula" Adult, Youth, and Dislocated Worker funding)or American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funding Napa County received in the Adult, Youth, and Dislocated Worker programs that is intended to be spent as quickly

as possible in an effort to re-train workers and get them back into the

workforce.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Participants enrolled in Workforce Investment Act (WIA) adult, dislocated worker, and youth programs are eligible to participate in an education and/or training program if it is determined that it is necessary for them to attain their employment goal and they are deemed suitable for the coursework. Boston Reed Company offers a variety of health career certificate programs including Clinical Medical Assistant, Pharmacy Technician, and Phlebotomy. Under the WIA program, job skills training is procured by customer choice. The State requires that each school meet designated requirements; once these requirements are met, the school is placed on the State's Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL). Participants have the right to choose any school from this list for their job skills training. Boston Reed Company is on the State's ETPL.

Approval of this amendment will enable the contractor to receive an increase in tuition and to include Phlebotomy for Medical Professionals, Medical Biller, and Administrative Medical Assistant courses on the list of certificate programs offered. The increase will allow HHSA to train nine additional clients. Since the aggregate amount paid to this contractor will exceed the Purchasing Agent's authority to sign the amendment, it is being presented to the Board for its approval.
