SUBJECT: Revision of Capital Assets Schedule

RECOMMENDATION

Chief Information Officer requests a revision of the Schedule of Approved Capital Assets in the Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 in the amount of \$40,000 to purchase six additional public safety radios/repeaters.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Today's requested action is to revise the approved Information Technology Services' (ITS) Capital Asset Schedule for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 so ITS can purchase six additional public safety radios/repeaters in lieu of two combiners to replace end-of-life equipment and improve functionality of the County's public safety radio infrastructure.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Information Technology Services' approved Capital Asset Schedule for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 included six public safety radios/repeaters (which receive a weak radio signal and retransmit it at a higher level for enhanced coverage) for \$54,000 and four combiners (which combine multiple radio signals into one signal) for \$80,000. To date, \$6,514 has been spent on the purchase of one combiner. In support of current projects, ITS is requesting the \$40,000 allocated for two combiners be used for the purchases of six additional public safety radios/repeaters (12 total) to replace end-of-life equipment.

Section 8E of the County Policy Manual states that County departments need the Board of Supervisors approval to reallocate fixed asset appropriations, either through the budget process or a Board of Supervisors meeting.
