#### **FISCAL STATUS:**

Significant Comments: Typically the "Operating Expenditures to date" would

include the first debt service payment. This year, instead of paying it on the last day in July, the payment was made in August, which contributes to the lower than "Historical Expenditures to date". In addition, the intrafund transfer from the Operating to Capital Fund has not been done yet. Cash flow in the Capital Fund has been sufficient. We will monitor this closely and make the fund transfer when funds become low in the

Capital Fund.

Summaries of Operational Highlights are as follows:

#### **COLLECTIONS:**

Significant events for the month of July 2017 in Collection System Maintenance include:

- The District had 0 Category 1 Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSO's), 0 Category 2 SSO's and 7 Category 3 SSO's during the month. (A Category 1 is defined as an SSO that reached a drainage channel and/or surface water or; an SSO that reached a storm drain pipe that was not fully recovered and returned to the sanitary sewer system. A Category 2 is defined as an SSO that is equal to or greater than 1,000 gallons that did not reach a surface water. A Category 3 is defined as an SSO that is less than 1,000 gallons that did not reach a surface water. These are usually minor overflows of less than 10 gallons from cleanouts on District laterals that can be cleaned up by the crews.)
- The repair crew installed 28 cleanouts and raised 3 cleanouts. Additionally, the service response/programs crew completed 85 work orders in support of the grease and odor control program, responded to 38 customer requests for service (17 were NSD problem) and closed out 218 mark and locate request tickets.
- The preventative maintenance crews ran work orders on 139 laterals, cleaned approximately 59,917 feet of main line and CCTV inspected approximately 15,731 feet of main line and 85 laterals.

### TREATMENT PLANT:

Significant events for the month of July 2017 in the Treatment Plant Department:

### Plant Operations:

- For July 2017, the plant's influent flow was 202 MG as compared to last year flow for July 2016 of 191 MG
- There was no flow to the Napa River for July 2017
- The production of recycle quality occurred for 31 days during July 2017 with a total distributed flow of 133 MG.
- There was .0" rain fall for July 2017 as compared to 0" rain fall for July 2016.
- Pond 4 end of the month recorded level reading was 16.35" as compared to July 2016 of 50.49". Total remaining pond capacity for July 2017 was 68% as compared to July 2016 remaining capacity of 60%.

### Power Consumption and Production:

- This July power consumption purchased from PG&E was 411 MWH in comparison to July 2016 purchase of 546 MWH.
- Cogeneration unit ran 729 of 744 hours for the month 97.98% uptime, averaging 273 Kw.
- Solar generation in July was 213 MWH, compared to 203 MWH in June.

- Rebuilt wet-end of FOG mix pump #1
- Replaced Lab UPS
- Bio-Air nutrient feed valve replaced

• Implemented into SCADA flow readings for load balance and aux water heat exchangers

#### Standby Power

- Plant generators ran 11 minutes due to grid loss of phase
- Riverpark, West Napa, Stonecrest operational testing only

#### **Influent Pumps**

• Pumps are all operational

#### Laboratory:

- Monthly composite **Influent** (**INF-001**) monitoring was conducted on July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017, no unusual results were identified. The following results were outside Local Limits:
  - o **Sodium:** 100.0 mg/L (Sodium Local Limit: 90 mg/L)
- Monthly **Recycle Effluent** (**REC-001**) monitoring was conducted on July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017. No unusual results were identified and all parameters were within the state's Water Reuse Requirements.

#### **RECYCLING:**

Significant events in the Recycling Department for July 2017 include:

• Recycled water delivered for the month of July 2017 (133.837 million gallons), as compared to July 2016 (119.374 million gallons) is higher due to increases in Golf

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Course, Commercial Landscape and Vineyard use. Delivered recycled water volume represents the sum of all use site flow meter consumption values.

• Staff continued land application of biosolids at the Jameson Reuse Site.

#### **POLLUTION PREVENTION:**

Significant events in the Pollution Prevention Department for July 2017 include:

- Two facility tours were given to the public.
- The Napa Safe Medication Collection Program is temporarily on hold while we make sure we are in compliance with the new California Board of Pharmacy regulations. The total amount of unneeded medications collected since program inception in September 2010 is 20,802.2 pounds.
- The District issued 16 Toilet Rebates for \$1,600.
- The District issued 1 ESME Washer Rebates at \$12.50.

## **ENGINEERING / CAPITAL PROJECTS / DEVELOPMENT:**

Significant events occurring in the Engineering Department for July 2017 include:

- Consultant started design of the West Napa Pump Station Rehabilitation Project.
- Consultant started design of the Headworks Equipment Replacement Project.
- Staff reviewed consultant proposals and selected a consultant for construction management and inspection services for the Recycled Water Reservoir Improvements Project.
- Staff issued Notice Inviting Bids for the Recycled Water Reservoir Improvements Project.
- Staff continued design of the 2018 Collection System Rehabilitation Project.
- Staff received preliminary design technical memorandum 3W utility water system improvements project.
- Consultant continued design of the Browns Valley Trunk Project.
- Consultant continued work on the Buildability/Constructability review for the Browns Valley Trunk Project.
- Consultant and Staff completed the Asset Management Plan and presented the Program to the Board.
- Contractor continued construction the MST Recycled Water Pipeline Expansion Project.
- Contractor continued construction phase activities for the Soscol/Sousa Trunk Rehabilitation Project.
- Contractor continued construction of the 2017 Collection System Rehabilitation Project.

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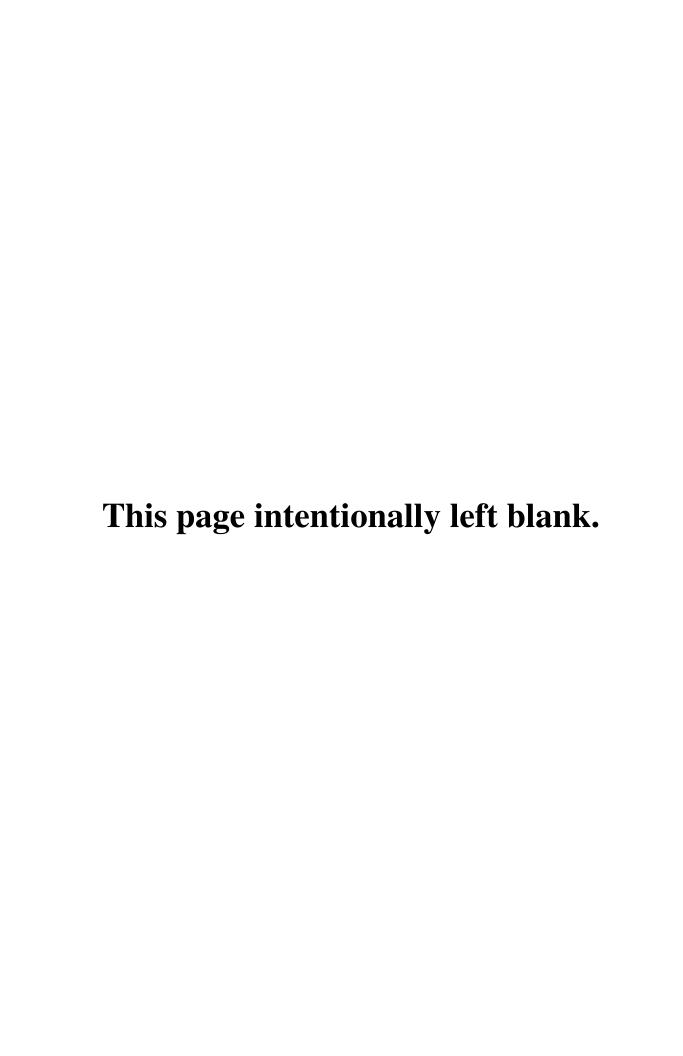
- Contractor continued construction of Manhole Adjustment Project Phase VI.
- Contractor continued construction for the LED Pole/Arm Fixture Replacement project.
- Staff issued notice inviting bids for the Earthquake Repair Project.
- Staff reviewed 42 sets of development plans and deemed 18 sets of plans complete. The approved plans consisted of one residential lateral, two residential buildings, seven tenant improvements, one commercial building, two commercial laterals, two public laterals, and three recycled water laterals.

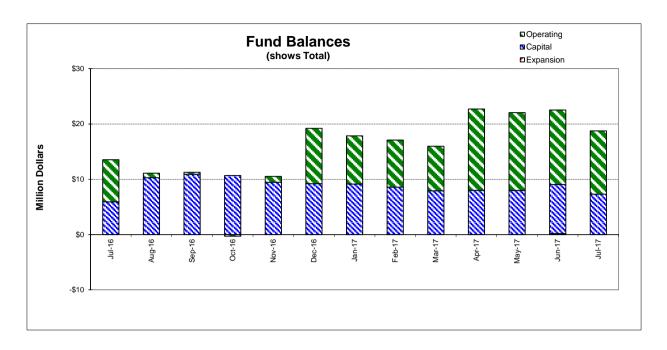
