If you're looking for a post-apocalyptic hideout, this is the perfect place: a cave, steel reinforced, heavy doors, and most importantly lots and lots of wine!

We stopped here as part of a private tour and the place is very interesting. A rocky hillside, not well adapted for growing, but an unlikely location for a conglomeration of 4 different families to combine their resources and produce wines. The 4 labels produced here today are Waugh Family, Patland, Lobo, and Buonchristiani.

This modern, man-made cave was dug out of the mountain 6 feet a day using machinery to become what it is today, and they are still expanding. I'm sure in a few years, this location will be even better with the plans that were shared by our wine guide.

The property also boasts a magnificent view of the surrounding countryside, making it a wonderful location for photos of the mountains and valleys.

The basic your cost \$40 a person and was reserved for us in advance. There are two pricier options available on their web site. The tour included a tour of the cave and 5 different tastings. Bottles were strategically placed around the cave, giving me the feeling of a lab mouse hunting out a reward of wine in an underground maze.

Our tour guide was very friendly and insightful walking us through the history of the property, the family wineries that participate at this location, the future plans for the property, and the wines and winemaking process.

The location is a feat to see! The wines were good and the view of the surrounding landscape was magnificent. Public service announcement: don't drink and drive; there's a higher likelihood you will meet a fiery death, Wile E. Coyote style, after driving off a steep embankment on the windy road that leads to this venue.
