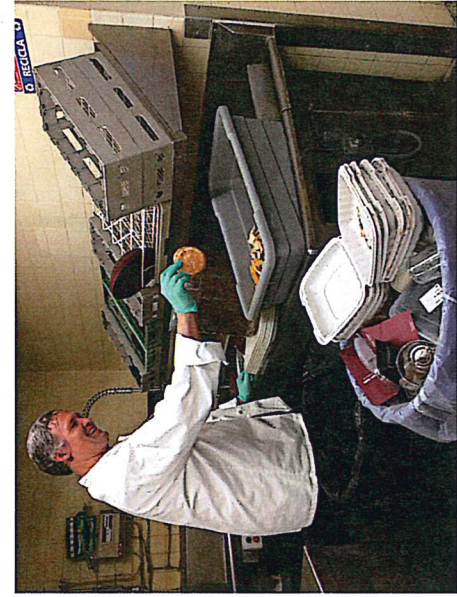


St. Helena Hospital Recycles and Composts!

A small footprint within St. Helena Hospital is making a substantial difference in waste diversion* Up Valley. After collaborating with Upper Valley Disposal & Recycling and the Upper Valley Waste Management Agency, the hospital now has a successful recycling program along with their established food composting program.

St. Helena Hospital began a food composting program with Upper Valley Disposal & Recycling in 2011. The program started as a joint effort between the hospital's facilities and nutrition services departments. The initiation of the food composting program was motivated by the opportunity to divert food scraps from the landfill but the hospital also saw the added benefit of less clogged drains and reduced water use in the kitchen. The hospital has overcome challenges often associated with food composting programs and has worked out a method for collection that works well for them. Nutritional services

staff place excess food returned from patient rooms and the cafeteria in a tub, when the tub is full it is transferred to a rack, and that

rack is wheeled downstairs to the food composting carts provided by UVDS.

Late last year nutritional services staff voted on a project to help the environment. Recycling

was the winner as staff noticed how many recyclable items were being thrown in the trash. Staff now collect recyclables from trays returned from the cafeteria and patient rooms. Staff also collects recyclables from food preparation, which includes everything from large tin cans to plastic raspberry trays. Recyclables are collected in small containers in the kitchen, then emptied into UVDS carts located outside.

The hospital is now diverting five tons of recyclables and one ton of food scraps each month. The combined weight those recyclables and food scraps is approximately that of an African elephant! We congratulate St. Helena Hospital and their hard working nutritional services staff for supporting our environment and doing their part to preserve our natural resources!

** Diversion is any combination of waste prevention activities – recycling and composting in this case – that reduces waste disposed at landfills.*

What Products are Acceptable at PaintCare Drop-Off Sites? What Products are Covered?

Architectural paints ("Program Products") are defined as interior and exterior architectural coatings sold in containers of 5 gallons or less. However, they do not include aerosol products (spray cans), industrial maintenance (IM), original equipment manufacturer (OEM), or specialty coatings. Here are examples:

Program Products (Acceptable)	Non-Program Products (Not Acceptable)
Interior and exterior architectural paints: latex, acrylic, water-based, silked, oil-based, enamel (including textured coatings)	Paint thinners, mineral spirits, solvents
Deck coatings, floor paints (including elastomeric)	Aerosol paints (spray cans)
Primers, sealers, undercoaters	Auto and marine paints
Shellacs, lacquers, varnishes, urethanes (single component)	Arts and crafts paints
Waterproofing concrete/masonry/wood sealers, metal coatings, rust preventatives and repellents (not tar or bitumen-based)	Caulking compounds, epoxies, glues, adhesives
Field and lawn paints	Paint additives, colorants, tints, resins
	Wood preservatives (containing pesticides)
	Roof patch and repair
	Tar and bitumen-based products
	2-component coatings
	Deck cleaners
	Traffic and road marking paints

Industrial Maintenance (IM) coatings
Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) (shop application) paints and finishes
Note: Leaking, unlabeled and empty containers are not accepted at drop-off sites.

Please call drop-off sites before you bring your paint to check the hours of operation and how much paint they can accept.

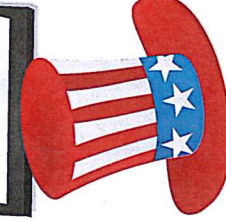
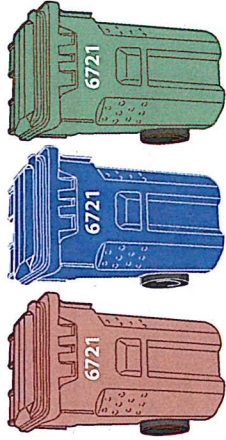
