# HAZARDOUS WASTE EVENT

Saturday April 8, 9:00 – 3:00

## Upper Valley Disposal & Recycling St. Helena Location

If you plan to rid your home of hazardous wastes as part of your spring cleaning, we have just the event for you! Upper Valley Waste Management Agency will host a one-day hazardous waste collection at the Upper Valley Composting and Recycling Facility located just south of the City of St. Helena and adjacent to Pestoni Family Winery on Saturday, April 8th, from 9 am to 3 pm. A licensed hazardous waste handling company will accept a variety of hazardous wastes from local residents at no charge. Participants will enter the driveway at 1673 St. Helena Highway (Hwy 29).

To be safe, residents should pack hazardous waste in the trunk or bed of their vehicle and transport it in amounts less than 15 gallons or 125 pounds per trip. The event is open to all who are UVDS residential custom-

ers or use Clover Flat Landfill, but the event is for households only.

Businesses that generate limited quantities of hazardous wastes will be able to dispose of them on Friday, April 7th, from 1- 4 pm. This collection event is open to only those businesses that generated less than 27 gallons or 220 pounds of hazardous waste per month. Appointments are required – call 1-800-984-9661 by 5 pm on Wednesday, April 5 to schedule a drop-off time. Businesses must pay disposal fees for hazardous wastes that they bring to this collection event.

### TRANSPORTATION REQUIREMENTS OF HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE:

Do not transport over 15 gallons or 125 pounds at one time. Leave products in the existing container, if possible. Make sure lids are on tight so containers will not leak. Transport containers in the trunk or in the back of the vehicle away from passengers and pets. Containers used for transport must be no larger than a 5-gallon bucket.

**HOLIDAY SCHEDULE** – Residential pick-up will be one day late following the Memorial Day Holiday, July 4th and Labor Day.

## COOLING YOUR COALS

### Do not put hot coals or ashes in your carts

Hot ashes or coals can cause severe burns and fire damage to properties. Follow these safety measures when disposing of them.

- Use metal cans no more than 30 gallons in size with tight-fitting metal lids.
- Fill cans with hot ashes only halfway so they cool quickly and are light in weight.
- Secure metal lids on cans to prevent spread of sparks or embers.
- Check, stir, and water ash cans for several days until completely cool.
- Avoid adding hot coals on top of cool coals by using a set of cans that can be used sequentially.
- Check to be sure that ashes are completely cool before placing them in compost cart.
