HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION AND TIRE RECYCLING EVENT

Saturday, April 28, 9:00 – 3:00

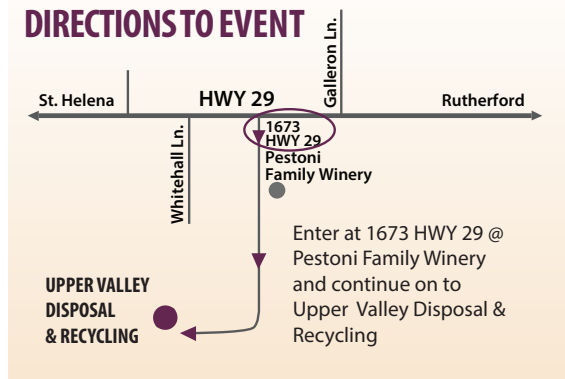
Upper Valley Disposal & Recycling St. Helena Location

Do you have hazardous waste and tires at your home that you want to get rid of for spring cleaning? We have just the event for you! Upper Valley Waste Management Agency will host a one-day hazardous waste collection at the Upper Valley Composting and Recycling Facility located just south of the City of St. Helena and adjacent to Pestoni Family Winery on Saturday, April 28, from 9 am to 3 pm. A licensed hazardous waste handling company will accept a variety of hazardous wastes from local residents at no charge. Participants will enter the driveway at 1673 St. Helena Highway (Hwy 29).

To be safe, residents should pack hazardous waste in the trunk or bed of their vehicle and transport it in amounts less than 15 gallons or 125 pounds per trip. The event is open to all who are UVDS residential customers or use Clover Flat Landfill, but the event is for households only.

Businesses that generate limited quantities of hazardous wastes will be able to dispose of them on Friday, April 27, from 1 pm to

4 pm. This collection event is open to only those businesses that generate less than 27 gallons or 220 pounds of hazardous waste per month. Appointments are required – call 1-800-984-9661 by 5 pm on Wednesday, April 25 to schedule a drop-off time. Businesses must pay disposal fees for hazardous wastes that they bring to this collection event.



New this year, Upper Valley Waste Management Agency will be partnering with Conservation Corps North Bay to collect unwanted tires! This will take place at the same location, date, and hours as the hazardous waste collection. Residents may drop off up to 9 tires, no tires over 46 inches in diameter will be accepted. Tires from businesses will not be accepted. No bicycle tires. Tires must be reasonably clean of dirt.

TRANSPORTATION REQUIREMENTS:

Do not transport over 15 gallons or 125 pounds at one time. Containers used for transport must be no larger than a 5-gallon bucket.

Do not transport over 9 tires at one time. No tires over 46 inches in diameter.

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE – Residential pick-up will be one day late following the Memorial Day Holiday, July 4th, and Labor Day.

Home Composting Workshops

Learn how to turn yard trimmings and kitchen scraps into compost at home.
Two worm composting workshops offered this year!

SIGN UP FOR A FREE WORKSHOP

at the end of your two hour workshop:

NOTE: for worm compost workshops only – participants assemble a working worm bin to take home (free).

Single Stream Recycling

Metal Items

- Aluminum cans
- Tin & steel cans
- Clean aluminum pans & foil
- Small scrap metal (36" or less)
- Pots, pans & utensils
- Loose lids from jars

Please No: Electronics or computer equipment

Plastic Items

- Bottles, jugs and containers, rinsed & empty
- Plastic grocery bags OK
- Plastic toys & tubs
- Clamshell trays & deli containers
- Buckets and laundry baskets
- Plant pots

Please No: Styrofoam, bubble wrap, food or plant material

Glass

- All beverage & food containers (labels OK)
- Please No: Window glass, mirrors, drinking glasses, ceramics, light bulbs or fluorescent tubes**

Paper Items

- Newspaper
- Magazines, catalogs & glossy paper
- Brown paper bags, paper packaging
- Egg cartons made from paper
- Carbonless paper
- Office paper of all colors
- Envelopes (labels or windows OK)
- Phone books and books with soft covers
- Junk mail
- Shredded paper
- Cereal and shoe boxes
- Cardboard (broken down)

Please No: Hardcover books, binders, paper tissues or towels with plastic coating, paper goods contaminated with food, oils or wax



Recyclables must be inside the cart for collection. Do not bag recycling. If bags are needed please use clear bags.
