# HAZARDOUS WASTE EVENT

Saturday, April 27, 9:00 – 3:00

## Upper Valley Disposal & Recycling St. Helena Location

Do you have hazardous waste at your home that you want to get rid of for spring cleaning? We have just the event for you! Upper Valley Waste Management Agency will host a one-day hazardous waste collection at the Upper Valley Composting and Recycling Facility located just south of the City of St. Helena and adjacent to Pestoni Family Winery on Saturday, April 27, from 9 am to 3 pm. A licensed hazardous waste handling company will accept a variety of hazardous wastes from local residents at no charge. Participants will enter the driveway at 1673 St. Helena Highway (Hwy 29).

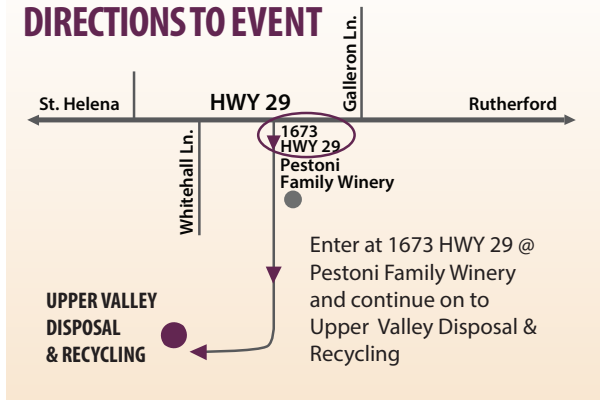
To be safe, residents should pack hazardous waste in the trunk or bed of their vehicle and transport it in amounts less than 15 gallons or 125

pounds per trip. The event is open to all who are UVDS residential customers or use Clover Flat Landfill, but the event is for households only.

Businesses that generate limited quantities of hazardous wastes will be able to dispose of them on Friday, April 26, from 1 pm to 4 pm. This collection event is open to only those businesses that generate less than 27 gallons or 220 pounds of hazardous waste per month. Appointments are required – call 707-259-8330 by 5 pm on Wednesday, April 24 to schedule a drop-off time. Businesses must pay disposal fees for hazardous wastes that they bring to this collection event.

### TRANSPORTATION REQUIREMENTS:

Do not transport over 15 gallons or 125 pounds at one time. Containers used for transport must be no larger than a 5-gallon bucket.

# What Goes in the Blue Bin?

## YES! This Goes in the Recycling.

### PAPER

Cardboard – must be flattened  
Boxboard (shoe boxes, cereal boxes, snack boxes and other similar boxes)  
Newspaper  
Magazines, catalogs, glossy paper  
Paper bags  
Paper packaging  
Paper Egg cartons  
Junk mail  
Phone books or soft cover books  
Envelopes (labels and windows ok to leave on)  
Office paper  
Shredded paper placed in clear bags

### PLASTIC

Rinsed & empty, leave caps on  
Bottles & jugs  
All CRV containers  
All rigid non-bottle plastics, such as: Tubs & containers (e.g. yogurt, margarine), Buckets, Toys (e.g. plastic tricycles), Clamshell trays & deli containers, Laundry baskets, Plant pots (no ceramics)

### METAL

Aluminum cans and clean foil  
Tin & steel cans  
Empty aerosol cans  
Scrap metal up to 36"  
Pots, pans and utensils  
Loose lids from jars

### GLASS

Bottles & jars,  
Remove food or liquid lids, caps or corks

\*Clear plastic bags may be used to collect shredded paper and mixed recycling from businesses. Do not use white, green or black bags – only clear.

## NO! This Doesn't go in the Recycling.

**NO** hardcover books, binders, tissues  
**NO** towels, paper with plastic coating, photographs or labels  
**NO** soiled paper, waxed paper, foil-lined paper  
**NO** waxed coated cartons, milk, juice, soups, or wine in a box  
**NO** plastic shipping envelopes  
**NO** Styrofoam  
**NO** plastic bags, sandwich bags, produce bags  
**NO** bubble wrap or plastic wrap  
**NO** window glass, mirrors, crystal, pyrex, pottery, ceramics  
**NO** electronics, computers, cell phones or household appliances  
**NO** light bulbs, tubes, fluorescent lamps or tubes  
**NO** hazardous waste, motor oil, paint, chemicals  
**NO** SHARPS or medications  
**NO** batteries  
**NO** pens, pencils, chap-stick, cosmetics  
**NO** clothing  
**NO** sleeping bags, blankets, pillows  
**NO** shoes, belts, purses, hand bags
