Description:

Expedite construction of a safety median barrier in the centerline of Route 12, straightening of unsafe curves, lowering the grade where possible, installing a ridge trail crossing for pedestrian and bicycle use and widening the roadway by adding one additional lane with room for a class II bike lane in each direction. This work shall be carried out in full compliance with both the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the California Environmental Policy Act (CEQA) and seeks to minimize and fully mitigate any adverse impact on the natural environment and adjacent agricultural lands. Funding for environmental mitigation is dedicated in this measure in Section I to guarantee environmental mitigation is carried out as specified in the adopted environmental documents.

Express Bus/Pre-Rail Service Program

Description:

The project would include the purchase and operation of express bus service in the proposed corridors. The express service would be provided by commuter oriented comfort coaches which would operate on existing roadways and along potential rail corridors. Signalization preemption would be made available to buses at critical intersections to ensure the efficient movement of buses through congested areas. Advanced transit technologies would be used to provide passengers on buses and at stations with information regarding transfers and arrival - departure times. A series of park and ride lots and transit stations would be built to provide convenient access to the express lines. The transit stations/park and ride lots would be built in such a way that they would be compatible with a future rail system. This option provides funding to complete design, engineering and environmental studies on rail as well as purchase rail right of way (ROW) if it becomes available.
