PROCLAMATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Government Code section 8630 and Napa County Code section 2.80.060(A)(2) authorize and empower the Napa County Executive Officer/Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when the County is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity and the Board of Supervisors is not then in session, subject to confirmation by the Board of Supervisors within seven days thereafter; and

WHEREAS, County Executive Officer/Director of Emergency Services by delegation has found that due significant rainfall that resulted in localized flooding, landslide and road closures a condition of extreme peril to life and property now exists in the County of Napa; and

WHEREAS, such conditions of extreme peril began on January 8, 2017 at approximately 12:01 AM; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors is not presently in session;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE NAPA COUNTY EXECUTIVE OFFICER/DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES DECLARES AND PROCLAIMS as follows:

- Conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within Napa County as of January 8, 2017 at approximately 12:01 AM due to heavy rains, saturated ground, and high tides which have toppled trees, washed out county roads, washed out creek banks endangering public infrastructure, and other damage and impacts; and
- 2. In consequence of said conditions and pursuant to Government Code section 8630 and Napa County Code section 2.80.060(A)(2), a local emergency now exists throughout Napa County.
- 3. During this local emergency the powers, functions, and duties of the Napa County Executive Officer and the emergency organization of Napa County shall be those prescribed by State law, and the ordinances, resolutions, and approved emergency services plans of the County of Napa.
- 4. This proclamation of local emergency shall be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors within seven days and if not confirmed and ratified by the Board of Supervisors shall expire on the seventh day or such earlier date as specified by the Board of Supervisors.
- 5. This proclamation and the contents thereof shall be published and promulgated in

as widespread a manner as reasonably feasible in light of the conditions prevailing during the local emergency.

6. The proclamation shall be submitted to the Governor requesting a State declaration of emergency given the impacts regionally by these recent storms.
