





While it is important that an educational program reach all of the community, it is especially vital that children are educated and made aware of the dangers of smoking. I would like to serve as a member of the Tobacco Advisory Board. I welcome an opportunity to serve my community and believe I can be constructive toward the Board's role in Napa County.




