WHEREAS, access to quality emergency care dramatically improves the survival and recovery rate of those who experience sudden illness or injury; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Medical Services system consists of emergency physicians, emergency nurses, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, firefighters, law enforcement, dispatchers, educators, administrators, and others; and the members of the Emergency Medical Services teams, whether career or volunteer, engage in thousands of hours of specialized training and continuing education to enhance their lifesaving skills; and

WHEREAS, in 1974, President Gerald Ford signed the first National Emergency Medical Services Week to draw attention to the sacrifice, dedication and commitment of Emergency Medical Personnel; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to recognize the value and accomplishments of the emergency medical services providers by designating Emergency Medical Services Week in Napa County.
