







### CASE COUNT CURVE














### WEEKLY CASE RATE (PER 100,000) BY AREA






























### COVID-19 HOSPITALIZATION DEMOGRAPHICS












# Projected capacity depends on 4 variables:

- Current estimated ICU capacity available
- Current community transmission
- Current regional case rates
- Proportion of cases admitted to the ICU

### WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?





- Napa County lands back in the Purple Tier
- Removes the Limited SAH Order (curfew)
- Current ICU capacity is 10%
- Hospital surge state health officer order will still take effect for counties where ICU availability for that county is ten percent (10%) or less
  - All hospitals and ambulatory surgery centers operating under the hospital license shall delay Elective Surgery Acuity Scale (ESAS) Tier 1 and 2 surgical procedures

# FREQUENTLY CHANGING STATE GUIDANCE

- Governor's Million Doses Initiative led to realization Napa County has the capacity to vaccinate many, but limited by vaccine supply
- Mixed messages about available vaccine supply
- Previous Phase 1B Tier 1:
  - 75 years of age or older (Around 9K)
  - First responders
  - Education and childcare
  - Food and agriculture
- Phase 1B Tier 1 changes now prioritizes people 65 years of age or older (17.4% of Napa County's population – over 24K)

# PRIORITIZATION GUIDANCE AS IT CURRENTLY STANDS




- Vaccinate Phase 1a Tiers 1-3 for those who missed previous opportunities (healthcare workers)
- Continue through 65+, healthcare workers, and prioritize first responders, food & agriculture workers, teachers and school staff
  - 75 plus
  - 65-74 with medical conditions
  - 65-74 without medical conditions
  - Prioritize disproportionately impacted populations
- Transition to age-based eligibility

### PROGRESS THROUGH PHASES AND TIERS



### STATUS: PHASE 1a / 1b-TIER 1



- Finishing Phase 1A
- Phase 1B Tier 1
  - Prioritizing 75 plus
  - Working through education and childcare and other missed sectors
- Insufficient vaccine supply may keep us at this phase and tier for a while

### UTILIZING VS SAVING SECOND DOSES



- Statewide, local health jurisdictions and healthcare systems are being asked not to save vaccines for second doses and are getting pressured to use them
- •CDPH will reallocate or enable local health officers to reallocate vaccines from providers who have not used at least 65% of their available supply on hand for a week and have not submitted a plan for administering the remaining vaccine to prioritized populations within four days of notice

# DELAYING 2ND DOSES NOT BACKED BY STATE OR FEDERAL GUIDANCE



- Decision to use second doses as first doses is not backed by vaccine rationing strategies and supply is uncertain
- UK proposed dose changes for how COVID vaccine is used:
  - Give only half the dose of vaccine assessed in the clinical trials
  - Delay administration of the second dose of the vaccine beyond the three-or four-week intervals tested in the phase 3 trials.
- The FDA and Western States Scientific Safety Review Workgroup concluded that the scientific data available to support the proposed changes are extremely limited
