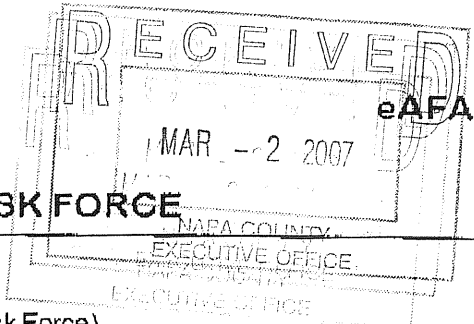


## Application for Appointment to Advisory Board on Alcohol and Drug Programs
