*Please explain your reasons for wishing to serve and, in your opinion, how you feel you could contribute:

I was born and grew up in the Santa Clara Valley (now better known as "silicon valley"!) and have been aware of the complexity and importance of water management issues in our state since I first started reading newspapers. I have recently moved to Napa (January 2005) and live on the southeastern edge of Napa County in Gordon Valley. As a citizen of this region, I am concerned with local and regional issues that require citizens education, awareness, and understanding in order to make wise choices in policy decisions.

I also have longstanding academic and professional interests in water issues in northern California. I have graduate degrees in natural resources management and will enroll as a graduate student at UC Davis in the Geography Graduate Group in fall, 2007, focusing on (1) riparian ecosystem restoration issues and (2) concerns about management of the Delta water system.

Prior to returning to northern California in 2002, I lived and worked in Washington, DC for 20 years as a natural resources policy analyst for the Marine Board of the National Academies. My role there was to provide information for policymakers related to the wise uses of the ocean and marine resources. When my family moved back to California, we lived for 2 years on the North Coast, where I became active in land conservancy and marine conservancy groups. Now that I have moved to Napa, I would like to increase my involvement in the local water and watershed issues that are of crucial importance to our region. I feel the combination of my education, experience, and interests make me a well-qualified candidate for this position.


