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Thanks for your interest in serving on the Napa County Arts and Culture Commission, please answer the following questions and attach a resume, if available. 1. Why do you want to serve in this position?

Art has been and is the primary focus of my life-long professional career as an artist, educator, advocate, nonprofit arts administrator and fund developer. I believe this to be a most fortuitous time to begin ground-breaking discussion and efforts to incorporate a Public Art Policy into Napa County's General Plan update-initiatives. I am gratified that finally, recognition will be paid to the vital role the ARTS can play in our community. I have been involved in advocacy efforts for many years at the local, state and national level and have compiled extensive research regarding Public Art Policy and Programs throughout the country.

2. What do you perceive is the role of the arts in the community?

I could write volumes in response to this question. Simply put, as an art advocate and professional, I speak to the fundamental, intrinsic value of art to the human experience and the vital role the arts play in the economic health and quality of life of our community....this has been proven many times over, from large metropolitan cities to small rural towns, and Napa County is no exception. Art in the Public sector:

- creates a positive economic impact and key stimulus for business and tourism
- beyond beautification, Public Art is a catalyst for community revitalization
- creates a positive image of the community
- attracts corporations, businesses and cultural tourism dollars
- creates a place that businesses and people want to relocate/live/visit
- attracts customers, improves safety and enhances ambiance
- creates jobs for artists
- and positively affects the education of our youth

ART is a priority for Parents

- Recent (2007) Harris Poll shows 93% believe the arts are vital to providing a well-rounded education for children
- Additionally (statistics gathered by the California Arts Council) indicate:
 - o 91% said it is important the children be exposed to art and cultural events, etc.
 - o 72% are willing to pay more taxes to "make sure that children...will be able to learn about the arts"

There are more than 300 public art programs in the United States funded by government. These programs are typically funded through a Per Cent for the Arts program (% of capital construction budgets). San Francisco, Sacramento, Los Angeles and San Diego have all been on the forefront of developing very successful % for the Arts programs. However, it is not just the big cities and city/county governments that have done so. The counties of Modoc, Humboldt, Santa Cruz, San Joaquin, Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo as well as the cities of Dublin, Tracy, Pleasanton, Stockton, Modesto, Antioch, Walnut Creek, Eureka, Susanville, Chico, Weaverville, Roseville, Davis, Woodland, Vacaville and Fairfield all have successful % for Art programs.

3. How would you represent the interests of the community on the Arts Commission? A resident of the Napa Valley since 1984, I reside in an unincorporated area of Napa County. I am a practicing visual artist, nonprofit art administrator, grants writer, fund developer, advocate and consultant for the ARTS. I have long held the vision of a vibrant art scene in Napa County...a sculpture garden incorporated into the Riverfront Development plans, art as part of all development and redevelopment projects throughout the County, community supported live theatre, art walks, public poetry readings, art in classrooms and curriculum, artist in residencies, art in public places.

I am familiar with many sectors of our community and work well with students, educators, community organizations, government agencies, funders, volunteers, committees, staff, board members and business professionals. This past year I sat on an advisory committee to the Napa County Office of Education, to advocate for the permanent inclusion of the ARTS in K-12 curriculum. I currently sit on the Public Art Committee of the Arts Council of the Napa Valley. I am a founding board member of the Napa Valley Opera House, Inc., the Napa Film Festival and the California Assembly of Local Arts Agencies. I am a former President of the Volunteer Council of the di Rosa Preserve: Art and Nature; and on the original faculty of Leadership Napa. As Executive Director of the then called Napa County Arts Council, I acted as the liaison between the local arts community, the Napa County Board of Supervisors and the California Arts Council. As Executive Director of the Solano County Arts Alliance I performed similar duties.

4. What strengths/expertise/special skills would you bring to the Arts Commission? My formal education and solid professional experience in the ARTS, outreach, marketing, program development, strategic planning and fundraising would enable me to make a meaningful contribution in helping the Napa County Arts and Cultural Commission achieve its goals in a timely manner.

I hold a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of California, Berkeley; a Professional Clear Multiple Subject Teaching Credential with a Cross-cultural Language Acquisition Development Emphasis (MCLAD) and Single Subject Authorization in Art; and I am a graduate of the Getty Leadership Institute, University of California, Berkeley.

Accomplished in leadership, team-building and advocacy. Active at the local, state and national level, I am particularly familiar with the challenges facing the ARTS and our community today.

Strategic planning, needs assessment and periodic evaluation of program and fund development with the participation of staff, board and colleagues have resulted in successful programs, projects and campaigns under my management.

I currently write grants for nonprofit organizations and am a consultant in community arts development. As an effective leader, educator and facilitator my public speaking skills have proven useful at the local, state and national levels. I have compiled extensive research in Public Art Policy and am scheduled to speak later this year before the Fresno County Board of Supervisors about county Public Art Policy and its benefits.


