 Governor expected to sign transportation bill (SB1) he following members of the public spoke: James Hinton, Theresa Libert.
 - Affordable housing bills; Staff will distribute a list of housing bills under consideration in the Legislature. Discussion and possible action schedule for next Legislative Subcommittee meeting on Monday April 17.

 - ACA 4 (AGUIAR-CURRY): Affordable Housing and Infrastructure: Seeks an additional exception to the 1% ad valorem tax limit that would authorize a city, county, or city and county to levy an ad valorem tax to service bonded indebtedness incurred to fund the construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, or replacement of public infrastructure or affordable housing, if the proposition proposing that tax is approved by 55% of the voters of the city, county, or city and county. (Aguiar-Curry seeks support)

CSAC: SUPPORT RCRC: WATCH

Unanimous vote to approve and send to Board of Supervisors.

• AB 556 (LIMON): Fines for local land use and development codes: Gives local governments authority to increase fines for one-time violators of land use and development codes who do not obtain a permit where one is required. (Morrison seeks support)

CSAC: PENDING RCRC: NO POSITION

Unanimous vote to approve and send to Board of Supervisors.

• AB 1372 (LEVINE: Crisis stabilization units; psychiatric patients: Establish a process by which a certified crisis stabilization unit may be authorized to provide medically necessary crisis stabilization services to beneficiaries for an extended period in those cases in which a beneficiary in the unit needs inpatient psychiatric care, but an appropriate inpatient bed is not available. (County HHS supports)

• AB 1665 (GARCIA, AGUIAR-CURRY, HOLDEN, MCCARTY): Telecommunications: Retains the goal of approving funding for telecommunications infrastructure projects that will provide broadband access to no less than 98% of California households, but would

provide that this goal is to be achieved by December 31, 2023. (Dillon seeks support)
