Sometimes it occurs because you weren't paying attention, other times it's because you are in a hurry. No matter the motivation behind running a red light, that doesn't make it any less illegal and dangerous. In 1995, the Federal Highway Administration created the "Stop Red-Light Running Program" to help educate the public on the dangers of red-light running and increase enforcement at a grassroots, community level. A key platform of this effort is "National Stop on Red Week", which takes place annually from August 5 through August 11 to promote the Federal Highway Administration's campaign to stop this careless practice. The "National Stop on Red Week" seeks to raise awareness of the serious issues running red lights cause on our roadways, as well as to promote ways in which you and your community can make a difference in ending this dangerous act.
