Dear Commissioners:

Julie and I have resided at 1445 South Whitehall Lane since 1989 when the footprint and impact of Upper Valley Disposal (UVDS) was significantly smaller. The Public Hearing is scheduled for Wednesday, March 7 regarding UVDS Use Permit Minor Modification # P16-00180-Min Mod.

Whitehall Lane has undergone a facelift recently with Pat Cahill's speculation house and the approval of his winery. It seems as if the neighborhood is challenged again with a new request by UVDS for:

- 1. Construction of a 15,000 square foot building to fully enclose an existing composting blending area
- 2. Construction of a compressed natural gas (CNG) refueling pump to allow replacement of the existing diesel fleet; and
- 3. An increase in the amount of food material composting from the current 1,950 tons per year to 4,500 tons per year without increasing total of 34,000 tons per year.

When will the Planning Commission realize that a rural community has limits on growth; limits on traffic; limits on flooding issues; limits on the quality of life, which includes odors from hazardous waste sites such as this as well as noise from the dumping of glass at night and sounds from safety features on vehicles backing up?

This issue is huge and affects hundreds of residents and households not only on Whitehall Lane but also on neighboring streets and highway 29.

We are asking for a delay so that we have time as a community to understand the scope of the project, the adverse affect on our neighborhood and appropriate mitigations.
