The Valley Waste Upper Management Agency (UVA) is the public agency that oversees recycling, greenwaste, foodwaste, and trash collection in Yountville, St. Helena, Calistoga, and the surrounding county areas. The agency has received requests from residents of these communities hold at least one Household Waste (HHW) Hazardous collection event in the up-valley area each year as a convenient way to dispose of more difficult unneeded or outdated hazardous materials such as pesticides, pharmaceuticals, and solvents (which are accepted only at the HHW facility on Devlin Road in American Canyon). Upper Valley Waste Management Agency sponsored similar events prior to 2009, but had to discontinue them due to a lack of funds.

The purpose of this letter, and the attached postcard questionnaire, is to gauge your interest in having the agency again pay for HHW collection events in the up-valley area. The cost of sponsoring the events would be covered by a once a year "surcharge" on your garbage bill. In the Town of Yountville only, the town is interested in using this surcharge to pay for the annual Town Clean Up Days rather than an HHW collection event, if there is sufficient citizen support.

Those of us on the Board of Directors of Upper Valley Waste Management Agency have asked for your input on the agency's waste management program decisions in the past. Your feedback has been important in driving our ultimate decisions. We want to hear from as many up-valley residents as possible, so please return the attached post card as soon as you can, but no later than April 30. We look forward to receiving your input.
