SUBJECT: Acceptance of \$5,000 grant from the Community Foundation of the Napa Valley

RECOMMENDATION

Library Director requests approval of the following actions relating to the grant from the Community Foundation of the Napa Valley:

- 1. Acceptance of the grant in the amount of \$5,000 for the Library's Literacy Program; and
- 2. Approval of Budget Transfer No. 48 increasing appropriations for Literacy Services by \$5,000 with offsetting revenues in the Library budget. (4/5 vote required)

The Community Foundation of the Napa Valley, representing an anonymous donor, has offered a grant of \$5,000 to the Napa City-County Library for Literacy Services.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The Community Foundation of Napa Valley has informed the library of an anonymous donor who would like to give the Library Literacy Center a grant of \$5,000 to support the existing adult literacy program. There was no application process for this grant. The Napa City-County Library's Literacy Center uses volunteer tutors to provide one-on-one and small group tutoring for adults who need to develop reading skills and for English as a Second Language adult learners. This grant would enable the Library Literacy Center to enhance its services and increase its program activities.
