**SUBJECT:** Amnesty Week for Library Overdue Fines

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Library Director requests authorization to waive fines for overdue library materials from February 6 - 12, 2006.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Napa City-County Library proposes to have a fine-free week from February 6-12, 2006, in honor of the library's 90th birthday on February 9.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**

Discretionary Justification: Charging of overdue fines is at the discretion of the local jurisdiction.

otherwise have remained missing and would have to be purchased.

Consequences if not approved: Overdue fines would be charged as usual. Missing materials might remain

missing and have to be replaced, if replacements are available.

## **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION**

Public Libraries find it worthwhile to periodically offer amnesty for overdue materials for a number of reasons: (1) The library gets back long-missing items which often are out of print, and therefore are irreplaceable, (2) Library customers have an opportunity to clear their record, thus returning their card to active status, and (3) It creates good public relations.

The proposed waivers would only apply to overdue fines on materials returned during the specified week. Charges for lost or damaged materials would not be waived. It would be limited to the week of February 6-12, 2006 and would occur at all Napa City-County Libraries, including the Napa Main Library, the American Canyon Library, the Calistoga Library and the Yountville Library. The St. Helena Library is not part of the Napa City-County Library system.

This fine amnesty period is proposed to help celebrate the Library's 90th birthday. On February 9, 1916, the Napa County Free Library was established under the California County Free Library Law. The project was delayed by World War I, but in September of 1919, Mrs. Estelle de Ford was appointed Napa County Librarian to start the new library on January 1, 1920. The Napa City-County Library's last amnesty period was in January 2005, during which approximately 900 items were returned fine-free.
