## **RECOMMENDATION**

Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer of Weights and Measures requests approval and authorization for the Chairman to sign the renewal of Agreement No. 8305 with the Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) for a maximum of \$15,169 for the term July 1, 2015 through February 29, 2016 for reimbursement of expenditures for collection and submission of historical compliance and enforcement data.

The authorization of this agreement with the Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) and provides for reimbursement to the County for collection of complete compliance and enforcement data to assist DPR in carrying out its Enforcement Evaluation and Improvement Project (EEIP).

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT**

#### **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION**

The renewal of this agreement provides for reimbursement of costs associated with the collection and submission of historical compliance and enforcement data. This will assist DPR in its compliance with the Federal Insecticide Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) statutory requirements pursuant to delegated enforcement authority from U.S EPA through the three-party Cooperative Agreements' between U.S EPA, DPR and County Agricultural Commissioners and Sealers Association, and Food and Agriculture Code section 2281.

This agreement has been backdated to July 1, 2015. The Agricultural Commissioner did not receive notice until early December due to delays in Federal funding.
