RECOMMENDATION

Acting Director of Health and Human Services requests approval to accept two anonymous donations totalling \$10,000 to be used for the benefit of the Children's Trust Fund.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Approval of the requested action will allow the acceptance of two anonymous donations totalling \$10,000. The donations will be used for child abuse prevention services funded by the Children's Trust Fund.

Discretionary Justification:	Child abuse and neglect can be reduced by supporting child abuse prevention programs. Donations made to the Children's Trust Fund provides for these vital child abuse prevention activities.
Is the general fund affected?	No
Future fiscal impact:	There is no future fiscal impact past the current year.

Consequences if not approved: If this action is not approved, the Child Welfare Services Division will not be able to use the \$10,000 in donations to the Children's Trust Fund to provide child abuse prevention programs in the community.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Prevent Child Abuse America (2007) estimates that the direct cost of child abuse and neglect in the United States exceeds \$33 billion every year. This cost can be significantly reduced by focusing efforts on prevention programs.

In November and December 2013, the County received two donations totalling \$10,000 to be used for child abuse prevention services funded by the Children's Trust Fund.

The County's policies and procedures regarding donations require Board approval of donations over \$1,000.
