RECOMMENDATION

Director of Health and Human Services requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign the acceptance of an award of local assistance funds from the California Department of Health Services in the amount of \$10,000 for the term July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007 to fund tuberculosis control activities.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Approval of this action will allow HHSA to accept funding from the California Department of Health Services to support efforts to control tuberculosis in Napa County.

Discretionary Justification:	This action is discretionary in that HHSA is not required to apply for this funding. The Department of Health Services has awarded Napa County funding for tuberculosis control and prevention activities. Funds will be used to offset Fiscal Year 2006-2007 budgeted use of Realignment funds for these activities.

Future fiscal impact:	The agreement terminates June 30, 2007.

If this Acceptance of Award is not signed, less funding will be available for tuberculosis control activities.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

This action will allow HHSA to accept the award of local assistance funds from the California Department of Health Services Tuberculosis Branch to support efforts to control tuberculosis in Napa County. The funds will pay for a portion of the Communicable Disease Investigator's salary and provide bus tokens and other transportation vouchers for clients to attend necessary medical appointments.
