SUBJECT:	Disposal of County Surplus Property

RECOMMENDATION

County Executive Officer/Purchasing Agent and Director of Public Works request the following:

- 1. Declare certain items of personal property as surplus and no longer required for public use, remove them from inventory, and dispose of them at public auction; (4/5 vote required) and
- 2. Declare certain items of personal property as surplus and no longer required for public use, and authorize the Purchasing Agent to dispose of these items by donating them to On the Move Voice Our Independent Choices for Emancipation Support (VOICES), a tax-exempt health and human service organization.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Public Works Department has accumulated a variety of surplus items and is recommending disposal of these items at public auction. These items consist primarily of antiquated office furnishings and equipment, including obsolete computer equipment. These items have outlived their useful life, have been removed from service, and are no longer required for public use. California Code Section 25363 authorizes the Board of Supervisors, upon a four-fifths vote, to sell at public auction, and convey to the highest bidder, for cash, any property belonging to the county and not required for public use.

On the Move - VOICES has contacted the Public Works Department requesting a furniture donation. The Department is recommending these items be donated to On the Move - VOICES pursuant to California Government Code Section 25372, which authorizes the Board of Supervisors, by majority vote, to donate any real or personal property that the Board declares to be surplus to public agencies, public schools, and any organization exempt from taxation pursuant to 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c) (3), that is organized to provide health or human services. The mission of On the Move - VOICES, which meets the requirements of Government Code 25372, is to create comprehensive services and resources to support the successful transition of foster youth, probation youth and group home youth, ages 16-24 in Napa County, to healthy, safe and productive independent adulthood.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The recommended surplus items have been determined to either be of very limited or no use to the County as they are antiquated, damaged, fail to meet current ergonomic standards (for furniture), fail to meet current county connectivity or performance standards (for computer equipment), and have been identified as nonfunctional. Attachment A is a list of antiquated office furniture and other non-fixed asset items. Attachment B is a list of computers, and Attachment C is a list of antiquated office furniture being donated to On the Move VOICES.

Surplus items sent by departments to Purchasing are screened to determine whether the items may be used by other departments prior to being placed on the list for disposal at auction. Surplus computer equipment that no longer meets county standards and is determined to be potentially useful is offered to eligible nonprofit organizations before being sent to surplus. In this case, the computer equipment listed on Attachment B is so antiquated as to not be useful to eligible nonprofit organizations.

On the Move - VOICES has contacted Public Works and requested a donation of County surplus office furniture. This non-profit organization meets the requirements of Government Code Section 25372 which authorizes the Board of Supervisors to approve the donation of any real or personal property that is declared surplus, to public agencies, public schools, and tax exempt health and human services organizations.
