SUBJECT: Assessor-Recorder -County Clerk Requests Approval of Contract with Secretary of State for

Election Assistance for Individuals with Disabilities (EAID)

RECOMMENDATION

Assessor-Recorder-County Clerk requests the following:

- 1. Adoption of a resolution approving a contract with the California Secretary of State to implement the Elections Assistance for Individuals with Disabilities (EAID) Program under Section 261 of the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA); and
- 2. Approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign a revenue agreement with the California Secretary of State for a maximum of \$7,244 for the term October 15, 2007 through May 31, 2008 for the purpose of providing federal reimbursement funds to assist in implementing EAID under HAVA.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Under Section 261 of the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA), the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) supplied funding to California Secretary of State to provide for improving accessibility to and participation in the elections process for individuals with the full range of disabilities. Napa County is eligible for up to \$15,288.86 in Federal reimbursement funds to assist in implementing the Election Assistance for Individuals with Disabilities (EAID) Grant Program. This contract is for the balance of our allocation in the amount of \$7,243.08 which must be expended by May 31, 2008. Original contract was executed on May 23, 2006. Federal and State procedures require a new contract rather than an amendment.

What is the revenue source? Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA) section 261 funding for Election

Assistance for Individuals with Disabilities (EAID) Grant Program. Napa County's remaining balance of original allocation of \$15,288.86 is \$7,243.08.

Is it Mandatory or Discretionary? Discretionary

Discretionary Justification: These funds are needed to insure accessibility of polling places, education of

voters and poll workers and training of poll workers and staff on issues

regarding disabled voters.

Is the general fund affected? No

Future fiscal impact: There is no commitment for additional programs beyond the grant funding.

However, additional funding may be available in future years from the same or

other sources.

Consequences if not approved: Napa County will not receive available Federal funds to reimburse County

expenditures for accessibility, education and training requirements.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Under Section 261 of the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA), the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) supplied funding to California Secretary of State to provide for improving accessibility to and participation in the elections process for individuals with the full range of disabilities. Napa County is eligible for up to \$15,288.86 in Federal reimbursement funds to assist in implementing the Election Assistance for Individuals with Disabilities (EAID) Grant Program. This grant is awarded for the following categories of activities:

- 1. <u>Polling Place Accessibility</u>-Make polling places, including the path of travel, entrances, exits and voting areas of each polling facility, accessible to individuals with the full range of disabilities;
- 2. <u>Equal Opportunity</u>-Provide the same opportunity for access and participation (including privacy and independence) to individuals with the full range of disabilities as for other voters;
- 3. <u>Accessibility Training</u>-Train elections officials, poll workers, and election volunteers on how best to promote the access and participation of individuals with the full range of disabilities in elections for Federal office; and
- 4. <u>Access Information</u>-Provide individuals with the full range of disabilities with information about the accessibility of polling places.

This contract is for the balance of our allocation in the amount of \$7,243.08 which must be expended by May 31, 2008. Original contract was executed on May 23, 2006. Federal and State procedures require a new contract rather than an amendment.
