RECOMMENDATION

County Executive Officer requests the appointment of Jennifer Stewart to serve on the Advisory Board on Alcohol and Drug Programs representing the category of Education with the term of office to commence immediately and expire January 1, 2008.

County Executive Officer requests the appointment of the Education representative to serve on the Advisory Board on Alcohol and Drug Programs. The Advisory Board has reviewed the application and recommends appointment.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Due to a resignation the position representing Education on the Advisory Board on Alcohol and Drug Programs is vacant. The County Executive Office recruited for the vacancy and received one (1) application, submitted by

Jennifer Stewart.

The purpose of the Advisory Board is as follows:

- a. to participate in the planning process for the development and maintenance of the County alcohol and drug programs;
- b. to review and evaluate the County alcohol and drug program budgets;
- c. to advise the County Alcohol and Drug Program Administrator and provide a public forum on the policies and goals of alcohol and drug programs and on other related matters which may be referred to it, or raised by the Advisory Board;
- d. to review and generally evaluate the community's programs, needs, services, and facilities; encourage public understanding of the problems of inappropriate use of alcohol and other drugs; encourage support throughout the County for development and implementation of effective programs; and,
- e. to report to the Napa County Board of Supervisors on a regular basis.

The Advisory Board allows for a minimum of thirteen members (13) and a maximum of sixteen (16) members comprised, to the extent possible, of representatives from law enforcement, the Probation Department, an educational institution, students (shared), the business community, the alcohol industry, the recovering community and interested citizens.
