SUBJECT: Renewal of Revenue Agreement with California Department of Food and Agriculture

RECOMMENDATION

Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer of Weights & Measures requests approval of and authorization for the Chairman to sign the renewal of Revenue Agreement No. 4760 with the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) for a maximum of \$3,585 for the term of July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015 for activities related to the performance of Sudden Oak Death inspections on nursery shipments.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The authorization of this agreement with CDFA provides for reimbursement to the County for inspection of Sudden Oak Death (SOD) host material entering or leaving the County and enforcement work performed from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The authorization of this agreement with CDFA provides for reimbursement to the County for SOD inspections performed according to the terms of the agreement to ensure Napa County can control the movement of the Oak Mortality Disease from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015.

This agreement is coming to the Board late due to delays in Federal funding. County policy requires revenue agreements to be approved by the Board of Supervisors.
