SUBJECT: Agreement with Allen, Shea & Associates ("Linkages")

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Health and Human Services requests the following actions relating to the "Linkages" project:

- 1. Approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign an agreement with Allen, Shea & Associates for a maximum of \$2,500 for the term November 15, 2005 through June 30, 2006 to provide consultation and implementation of the CalWORKs and Child Welfare Services "Linkages" project; and
- 2. Approval of Budget Transfer No. 14 increasing appropriations by \$5,000 in the Social Services budget with offsetting revenues from the Linkages grant to fund salaries, training and contract expenditures. (4/5 vote required)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Allen, Shea & Associates will provide consultation for the implementation and coordination of the CalWORKs and Child Welfare Services "Linkages" project. This vendor has specific experience in both, CalWORKs and Child Welfare. The Linkages project is designed to increase knowledge and implement practices to coordinate child welfare and public assistance programs in California to improve services to at-risk families.

What is the revenue source? HHSA was awarded a grant from the Child and Family Policy Institute

of California in the amount of \$5,000; \$1,550 of the grant will be used to fund the Allen Shea agreement. The remaining \$950 of the agreement will be

funded by the CWS and CalWORKS allocations.

The remaining \$3,450 of the \$5,000 grant will be spent on salaries, staff

trainings and associated travel.

Discretionary Justification: If this agreement is not approved, the funding will revert to the

grantor. CalWORKS and CWS will not be able to benefit from consulting services that will assist them in developing policies and procedures to better coordinate and manage services being provided to families concurrently

enrolled in their programs.

The project's goal is to make existing autonomous systems work toward similar goals with families that are receiving services concurrently from CalWORKs and Child Welfare.
