SUBJECT:	Animal Shelter Emergency Generator Design Professional Services Agreement Approval

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Public Works requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign an agreement with O'Mahony & Myer for a maximum of \$23,090 for the term of November 15, 2005 through June 30, 2006 for electrical engineering consulting services for the installation of a standby emergency generator at the Animal Shelter.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Installation of a standby generator is needed to maintain refrigeration, air conditioning, lighting and all other electrical essential services so as to have a functioning facility during power outages. Currently when power outages occur at the Animal Shelter, the freezer unit containing animal carcases does not maintain the required temperature and the air conditioning system does not function. This creates a lack of air movement that causes unacceptable odors throughout the building. Approval of this Agreement will provide for design and construction administration assistance for electrical engineering consultant services for the installation of a standby emergency generator.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The Animal Shelter facilities located at 942 Hartle Court periodically experience power outages. During these outages, the air conditioning system does not function, the freezer loses power and the temperature in the unit containing animal carcases becomes elevated - causing unacceptable odors to permeate the facility. The installation of an emergency generator will provide power to the facility during these outages. This project has a total estimated budget appropriation of \$362,000, which includes design and construction.

In early October Public Works staff issued a Request For Proposals to design the emergency generator for the Animal Shelter. Three responses were received and interviews with all three bidders were conducted. O'Mahony & Myer was the successful candidate. Therefore, approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign an agreement with O'Mahony & Myer for a maximum of \$23,090 for the term of November 15, 2005 through June 30, 2006 for electrical engineering consulting services for the Animal Shelter generator project is recommended. Upon completion of the design of the emergency generator Public Works will request Board approval for bids for construction for this project.
