EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Lee Driggers is retiring on December 28, 2013, having served the County of Napa for nearly 33 years.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Lee Driggers began his service to the County of Napa in January, 1981 and is now employed as a Senior Engineering Aide. He is retiring December 28, 2013, after nearly 33 years of service to the people of Napa County.

Lee was involved in the surveying for many significant Napa County projects during those years, including new bridges on Yountville Crossroad and James Creek Road, the new alignment of Petrified Forest Road, numerous bike lane improvements, various projects at the Napa County Airport, several new fire stations, construction of the new Animal Shelter and the solid waste transfer station, and closure of the American Canyon Landfill.

In recent years, Lee has also provided measurements of wells throughout the unincorporated area as part of the County's groundwater monitoring programs.

Most recently, Lee has been the mainstay of the office function of the County Surveyor's office, providing valuable consistency and reliability in his reviews of land surveying documents, having checked 499 Records of Survey, 182 Corner Records, and 44 subdivision maps including 12 for the City of St. Helena.

Lee can be counted on for a cheery greeting and excellent customer service to all members of the general public and the professional surveying community. On the occasion of his retirement, he is commended for his nearly 33 years of conscientious service, and wished Good Luck and Happy Kayaking in his new endeavors.
