# **RECOMMENDATION**

Director of Housing and Intergovernmental Affairs, on behalf of the Legislative Subcommittee, requests adoption of a resolution urging Congress to reauthorize and fund the Federal Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Since the late 1800s, the Federal government began providing special payments to rural counties to help support county roads and public schools. These payments were generated from 10 percent of gross receipts from timber harvests in national forests.

In the 1990s, the volume and value of timber harvested on national forest lands was drastically reduced, which led Congress to enact the Federal Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act (SRS) of 2000 (16 U.S.C. Sec. 7101 et seq.). SRS provided a six-year guarantee payment option that was independent of the revenue generated on the national forest lands. However, the law expired in 2013, resulting in a lapse in funding in fiscal year 2014.

The Rural Counties of California (RCRC) is seeking support to urge Congress to reauthorize SRS.
