BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Presentation of a proclamation recognizing January 29, 2010 as National Earned Income Tax Credit Day. The Earned Income Tax Credit was established by the Federal Government in 1975. In 2009 more than 1,000 working Napa County families received \$50,000 as Earned Income Tax Credits. Thousands of families in Napa County are eligible for Earned Income Tax Credits but they do not file for this credit because of lack of information. Several organizations have gathered to convene a collaboration that increases the income and builds the assets of low-income families and individuals in the county. This proclamation encourages all residents to applaud and support the agencies for their goal of ensuring that working families receive all tax credits they have earned.
