SUBJECT: Resolution of Local Support for funding application to BAAQMD Bicycle Rack Voucher Program

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Public Works requests adoption of a resolution authorizing the filing of an application for \$1,400 of funding from the Bicycle Rack Voucher Program, in order to purchase bicycle racks to be installed at the Napa County Fairgrounds in Calistoga.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Funding is available to the County of Napa through the Bicycle Rack Voucher Program. Working together with the Napa County Fair Association and local bicycling advocates, staff has identified the opportunity to install bicycle racks at numerous locations on the Napa County Fairgrounds property, which would be an eligible use of this funding. The funding available from the program is sufficient to cover 100% of the cost of purchase and delivery of the racks, with no local match required. Crews from the Fair Association will install the racks upon delivery.

What is the revenue source?	Awards are made in the form of Vouchers. Therefore, there is no cash flow to the County. However, to comply with the County's accounting rules, the voucher will be recorded on books as a revenue and an expense in the Property Management Maintenance budget unit 12210.

Discretionary Justification:	This program provides local public agencies with access to discounted or no-cost bicycle rack equipment and contribute to cost effectively reduce motor vehicle emissions by expanding the availability of new bicycle parking facilities in the nine-county Bay Area.

Consequences if not approved:	The County will not be able to take advantage of this program to receive no-cost bicycle rack equipment.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

Consideration and possible adoption of a Categorical Exemption Class 1: It has been determined that this type of project does not have a significant effect on the environment and is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act. [See Class 1 ("Existing Facilities") which may be found in the guidelines for the implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act at 14 CCR §15301; see also Napa County's Local Procedures for Implementing the California Environmental Quality Act, Appendix B.]

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The Bay Area Air Quality Management District's (Air District) Bicycle Rack Voucher Program (BRVP) provides local public agencies with access to discounted or no-cost bicycle rack equipment. The BRVP's goal is to cost-effectively reduce motor vehicle emissions by expanding the availability of new bicycle parking facilities in the nine-county Bay Area. Funding for the BRVP comes from the Air District's Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA) Regional Fund Program.

Up to \$900,000 is available to support the expansion of new bicycle parking (BRVP and e-lockers) in the Bay Area. All public agencies in the Air District's jurisdiction are eligible to apply to the BRVP. Awards are made in the form of vouchers for up to \$60 per new bicycle parking spot created, limited to a maximum of \$15,000 in total Voucher awards per applicant. Vouchers can only be redeemed for qualified equipment that is provided by vendors who are on contract with the Air District.

Working together with the Napa County Fair Association and local bicycling advocates, Public Works staff has identified the opportunity to install bicycle racks at numerous locations on the Napa County Fairgrounds property in Calistoga, which would be an eligible use of this funding. Working with the selection that is available through the vendors under contract with the District, staff has identified a product that will meet the fairgrounds' need at substantially less than the \$60 per new parking space limit. Therefore, the funding available from the program is sufficient to cover 100% of the cost.

Following approval of the grant application, County staff will purchase the racks through the voucher program, and arrange for delivery. Crews from the Fair Association will install the racks upon delivery, and will be responsible for their ongoing maintenance.

Although no cash will flow into or out of the County's books as a result of this grant, the vouchers will be recorded as revenue and the racks' cost recorded as an expense. The transaction will be documented in the Property

Management budget, Division 12210-53345.
