Presentation of a proclamation to Pam Kindig, Chair of the Napa County Library Commission, in recognition of the Library system's centennial birthday.

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

On February 9, 1916 the Napa County Free Library was established by the Napa County Board of Supervisors in an unanimous vote. Since its establishment, the library system has grown to consist of one library, three branches, a virtual library, Literacy Center, LifeWorks Career Center, more than 150,000 circulating items, and over 100 educational and informational programs for children, teens, and adults each month.

**BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION**
