SUBJECT:	Agreement and Certification regarding State Veterans Services allocation

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Health and Human Services requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign the following two agreements with the California Department of Veterans Affairs:

- 1. Renewal of Agreement No. 946, Subvention Certificate of Compliance, for release of the Fiscal Year 2004-2005 state funding for the County Veterans Service Office; and
- 2. A Medi-Cal Certificate of Compliance committing the County to assist veterans in obtaining benefits from non-Medi-Cal funding sources.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Napa County receives an allocation from the California Department of Veterans Affairs to assist in funding the Veterans Services Office. This year's allocation is \$30,000, which is the same as the Fiscal Year 2003-2004 allocation.

Discretionary Justification:	The state Veterans Services Office Fund is created through the sale of veterans license plates. These funds are shared among counties through a subvention program based upon counties' shares of statewide veterans

expenditures. The county subvention program pays counties for a portion of their administrative costs and for "workload units" perfomed.

The Medi-Cal cost-avoidance program pays counties for activities that county veterans services officers perform that may result in savings to the Medi-Cal program.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The Department of Veterans Affairs allocates funding to assist the County Veterans Services Office. Release of these funds requires a county agreement to provide veterans services, designation of a Veterans Services Officer who is qualified under the Military and Veterans Code, and a Medi-Cal Certificate of Compliance that commits the county to assist veterans in obtaining benefits from non-Medi-Cal funding sources.
