RECOMMENDATION

Presentation of a proclamation to Michele Grupe, Executive Director of Cope Family Center and Co-Chair of the Napa County Child Abuse Prevention Council (CAPC) declaring April 2018 as Child Abuse Prevention Month in Napa County.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Napa County Child Abuse Prevention Council (CAPC) is a countywide collaborative program leading the effort to prevent child abuse by supporting family-oriented, community-based prevention, awareness, education and training programs. CAPC is also mandated by law to recommend and improve services to meet victims' needs.

As part of the County's participation in the Napa County Child Abuse Prevention Council and its commitment to prevent child abuse, it is appropriate to present this proclamation to Michele Grupe who serves as the Co-Chair of CAPC.

The Napa County CAPC is part of a thriving network of CAPCs located in every county of California. The network is supported by the State of California Office of Child Abuse Prevention (OCAP). The Napa County CAPC is an active member of Prevent Child Abuse California, which is a statewide coalition dedicated to preventing child abuse.
