SUBJECT: Approval of Amendment No.3 to Agreement No. 8244 with County of Solano

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Corrections requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign Amendment No. 3 to Agreement No. 8244 with Solano County amending the terms to allow Napa County inmates to participate in Solano County jail work programs.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In December 2014, the Board approved an agreement with Solano County to house up to 75 inmates (increased to 125 by Amendment No. 1) to mitigate the loss of available jail beds due to the earthquake. A portion of the jail population remains housed at Solano County to mitigate the loss of available jail beds from the basement project. Today's action will amend the current agreement with Solano County to allow Napa County inmates to participate in Solano County jail work programs.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

In December 2014, Napa County entered into an agreement with Solano County to mitigate the loss of available jail beds that resulted from the 2014 South Napa Earthquake. State law allows counties to house pre-sentenced and sentenced inmates in contiguous counties. The agreement as currently amended provides for the housing of up to 125 Napa inmates at Solano County jail facilities. However, the current agreement prohibits Napa inmates from participating in Solano jail work programs.

The amendment proposed today will allow Napa County inmates to participate in Solano County jail work programs. Napa County inmates will be covered by Solano County's Workers' Compensation insurance policy at no cost to Napa County. Solano County currently covers Solano inmate workers under Solano County's Workers' Compensation policy.
