RECOMMENDATION

Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer of Weights & Measures requests approval of and authorization for the Chairman to sign Revenue Agreement No. 2683 with California Department of Food & Agriculture (CDFA) - Division of Measurement Standards for a maximum of \$2,325 for the term July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 for the reimbursement of expenditures associated with inspections and sampling of petroleum products.

Approval of the requested action will renew the County's agreement with California Department of Food and Agriculture - Division of Measurement Standards for reimbursement of services provided by the Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer of Weights and Measures Office from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Agreement No. 2683 provides for the reimbursement of costs associated with the Sealer of Weights and Measures performance of activities ensuring petroleum and automotive products sold within the State and County meet minimum quality and labeling standards. This agreement provides for the reimbursement of costs up to \$2,325 that are associated with the performance of petroleum inspections.
