BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The purpose of the Wildlife Conservation Commission (WCC) is to advise the Board of Supervisors on policy matters related to the preservation and enhancement of wildlife and their habitats. This includes how funds received by Napa County, which are comprised of Fish and Game fines, should be expended for the preservation, propagation, and protection of birds, mammals, fish, and amphibians.

The WCC consists of eight members appointed by the Board of Supervisors as follows:

- Four members representing the Public at Large;
- One Sportsperson/Angler;
- One Wildlife/Conservation representative;
- One Youth between the ages of 15 and 25; and
- One Planning Commission representative.

Staff requests the appointment of two applicants, Charles Burton and Michael Sipiora, to represent Public At Large on the Wildlife Conservation Commission (WCC).
